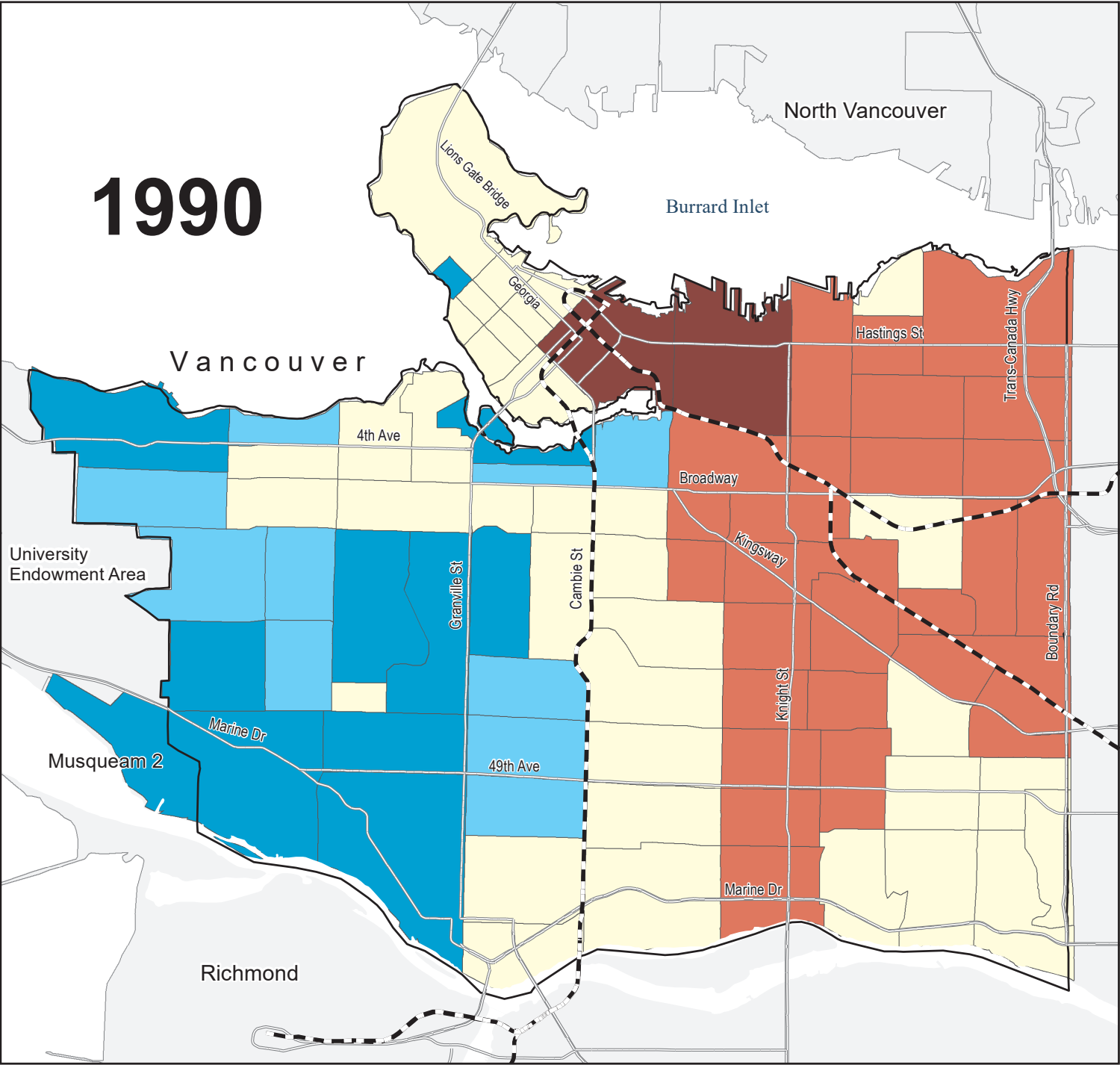


# Average Individual Income, City of Vancouver, 1990



## Census Tract Average Individual Income compared to the Vancouver CMA Average of \$46,821

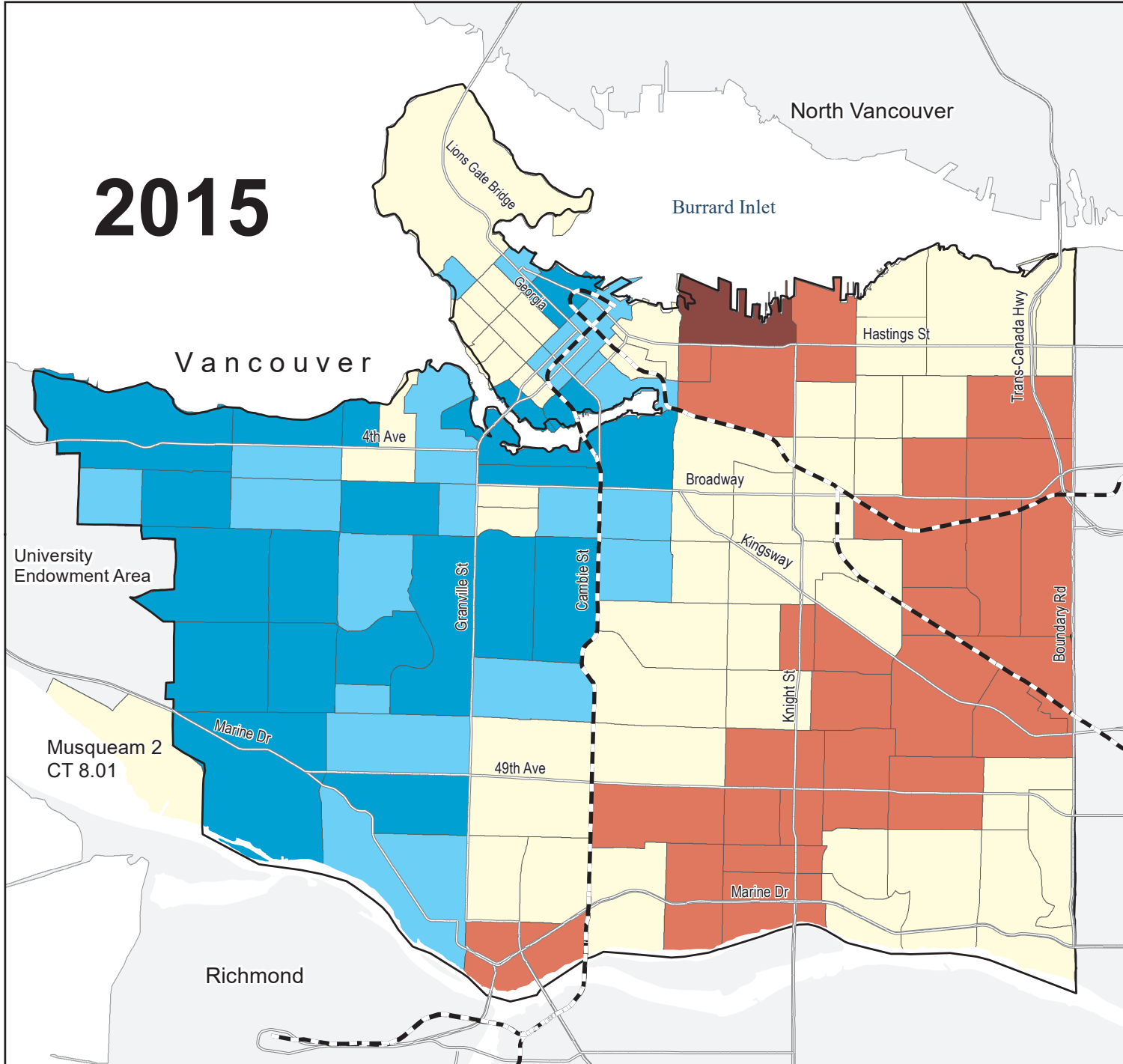
- Very High - 140% to 217% (10 CTs, 11% of the City)
- High - 120% to 140% (11 CTs, 13% of the City)
- Middle Income - 80% to 120% (35 CTs, 40% of the City)
- Low - 60% to 80% (28 CTs, 32% of the City)
- Very Low - 38% to 60% (3 CTs, 3% of the City)
- Not Available

Average individual income from all sources, before-tax.

Census tract boundaries are for 1991.

Census tract 8.00 which includes the Musqueam 2 census subdivision is counted as City of Vancouver here as the tract extends beyond the City boundary in census 1991.

## Census Tract Average Individual Income compared to the Vancouver CMA Average of \$46,821

- Very High - 140% to 333% (21 CTs, 18% of the City)
- High - 120% to 140% (17 CTs, 14% of the City)
- Middle Income - 80% to 120% (49 CTs, 42% of the City)
- Low - 60% to 80% (30 CTs, 25% of the City)
- Very Low - 55% to 60% (1 CTs, 1% of the City)
- Not Available

Average individual income from all sources, before-tax.

Census tract boundaries are for 2016.

Census tract 8.01 which is currently the Musqueam 2 census subdivision is counted as City of Vancouver here as this area used to be part of a larger tract with the City back in the 1981 census.
